DEATH OF MR. F. RANDS

Many people learned with regret of the death on Saturday last, after a brief illness, of Mr. **Fred W. RANDS**, one of the rate collectors of the Borough, a position he held for some twelve years. Deceased, who was 54 years of age, had been troubled with Asthma for a long time, and he continued at his work a long time after a holiday was needed. He was at all times most courteous and tactful, and he performed a rather unthankful office in such a way that he was liked by everyone. For many years he was in the Isle of Wight Volunteers, retiring with the long-service medal and the rank of colour-sergeant.

The first part of the service was held at the Parish Church, the Rev. C.L. BLAKE officiating. Besides the family mourners, there were present-representing the Town Officials- the Mayor (Alderman G.A. BLACKALL), Councillors J.B. PURNELL, C. J. DE LAUNAY, and Messrs. W. C. MATTHEWS (Assistant Overseer), E. HUNT (Clerk to the Education Committee), J. M. C. LOADER (Collector), F. W. MUNT (Auditor), J. ELDRIDGE (Sanitary Inspector), E. WHITE (Water Inspector), J.B. COOMBES, W. HOPGOOD, J.W. TRODD, J.L LEAMORE, E. SWEETMAN, S.A. MILLETT, S. BENNETT and F. MORRANT. Colonel E.W. CRADOCK, Major ELLERY, Colour-Sergeant W. RUSSELL, Sergeant PALMER, Sergeant HOLLOWAY and Sergeant Instructor EVANS (of the Isle of Wight Rifles), Sergeant L.C. WOODS (Yeomanry) and ex-Colour Sergeant J. CONWAY were also present. The coffin bore the inscription:-

FREDERICK WILLIAM RANDS, died April 7th, 1912 aged 54
