HAYLANDS WIDOW'S DEATH.

A sad case of sudden death occurred at the weekend, when Mrs. **Alice Rose MCCAUGHIN** (61), widow, of 7 Colenutt's-road, Haylands, was found dead in bed. On Friday night she appeared in her usual state of health, but the next morning she was found dead in bed, death being due to a hemorrhage. She had gone through many trials, her husband who belonged to the Post Office Rifles, being killed in a raid in London during the war, and soon afterwards the news was conveyed to her that her eldest son had been killed in France. All this told upon her and she suffered a severe shock. She leaves one son, who resided with her, with whom much sympathy is expressed, also her brother, Mr. H. NELSON, of the Southern Railway, Pier Gates.

An inquest was not considered necessary, as the doctor made a post mortem examination, which was satisfactory.
