DEATH OF MR. W. T. GREENUP, F.R.G.S.

The death occurred on Saturday of Mr. William Thomas GREENUP, who had been for many years principal of Mount House School, George-street. Mr. GREENUP, who was 68 years of

age, was formerly assistant master at the Leys School, Cambridge. On coming to Ryde he took a deep interest in educational work, and was for some time a member of the Ryde Education Committee. The work of the Wesleyan Church and Sunday-schools also found in him a staunch supporter- he was a local preacher of the denomination- while his familiar figure was often seen on the platform at public meetings in aid of religious work.

The funeral took place at the Ryde Cemetery on Tuesday. The first part of the service was held at the Wesleyan Church, where the Rev. R B. SAUL officiated, the same minister pronouncing the committal sentences at the graveside. Other ministers assisting were the Revs. B. F. FIELDING and Thomas BRACKENBURY. In the church the hymn "Now the labourer's task is o'er" was sung. The principal mourners were the Rev. Dr. GREENUP (principal of St. John's College, Highbury), son of the deceased, Miss GREENUP (daughter), Miss MILLAN, and Messrs. H. H. POLLARD, J.P., C.A., George GODFREY, John MEW (Sandown), A. PREWER (secretary of the Y.M.C.A.), and John MORRIS, and some of the pupils at Mount House School. Among those also following were the Revs. H. H. TURNER, David A. DAVIES, and D. WATKINS, Mrs. FUTCHER (St. Helens), Messrs. Arthur ANDREWS, J.P. (president, Ryde Y.M.C.A.), James DORE, J.P., C.A. (Sandown), S. FOWLER, J.P., J. B. PURNELL, A TEAGUE, E. JAMES, C.C., A. G. MILLWARD, J.P., C.C., A. HOLMES, J.P., P. BLOWEY, A. BLACKBURN, F. LIGHTFOOT, F. WRIGHT, T. C. FLOWER, O. BRADING, C. B. GRACE, P. MACLEAN, E. DAMP, H. HARBER, T. J. GRIMSDICK, P. COLLISTER (Bembridge), T. H. HALSTED, C. YOUNG, H. CHIVERTON, C. WARNE, and J. H. MUMFORD. The coffin bore the inscription "William Thomas GREENUP, died May 6th, 1911, aged 68 years."
