DEATH OF I.W. RIFLES VETERAN –

The funeral service took place at St. Michael's Church on Saturday for Mr. **Ernest Harry LOCKE**, aged 71, of 8 St. Michael's-avenue, who died on Wednesday week at St. Mary's Hospital, Newport. Born at Haylands, he served in the 1914-18 war with the I.W. Rifles, and, after being commissioned, in the Dorset Regiment. During the last war he was a deputy captain in the firewatching service. For more than 60 years he was associated with St. Michael's Church. He became a choirboy at the age of 11 and later served in the sanctuary and for 12 years was M.C. until his retirement through ill-health a year ago. Until this year he served on the Parochial Church Council, of which he was one of the original members. A widow and son survive him. The coffin was received into St. Michael's Church on Friday week, when vespers of the dead were sung. On Saturday solemn requiem and absolutions preceded the funeral service, which was conducted by the vicar (the Rev. M. O. H. CATON). The choir and servers were present, and the hymn "Jesu, meek and lowly" was sung. Mr. A. WOODLAND was organist. The mourners were Mr. M. J. W. LOCKE (son), Mr. and Mrs. R. F. LOCKE, Sqdn.-Ldr. And Mrs. S. V. LOCKE, and Mr. and Mrs. R. C. LOCKE (brothers and sisters-in-law). Mrs. M. J. W. LOCKE (daughter-in-law) was unable to be present. Interment took place at the Cemetery. The floral tributes included those from the vicar, servers and congregation of St. Michael's Church, and friends and neighbours. The arrangements were carried out by Messrs. C. LANGDON, by whom Mr. LOCKE was employed for many years.
