RETIRED POSTMAN'S DEATH –

Mr. **George BOURNE**, who died on Wednesday week, at 41 St. John's-road, in his 84th year, was a well known postman. As a boy he joined the Queen's Royal Regiment and served for 22 years, attaining the rank of sergeant. He was in the employ of the Post Office for over 20 years and retired when he was 60. His wife died in 1943 and he leaves three daughters and a son. Canon A. CORY, R.D. (vicar), officiated at the funeral service at All Saints Church on Monday. The mourners were Mr. George BOURNE (son), Mrs. E. JACOBS, Mrs. R. WATTON, and Mrs. A. PECKHAM (daughters), Mrs. G. BOURNE (daughter-in-law), Mr. A. PECKHAM (son-in-law), Mr. C. G. JACOBS (grandson), Mr. K. RAYNER (also representing Mrs. RAYNER, grand-daughter), and Mr. and Mrs. P. AVARD (nephew and niece), Messrs. F. BLOW and W. BISHOP (former Post Office colleagues) were also present. The interment was at Ryde Cemetery.
