WELL-KNOWN TAILOR DIES AT RYDE LATE MR. M. OSBORNE

A son of the man who established OSBORNE's tailors business in Union-street nearly 100 years ago, Mr. **Malcolm OSBORNE**, died at his home 13 Union-street, Ryde, on Tuesday.

A Ryde man Mr. OSBORNE took over the business upon the death of his father. He was aged 77.

He was among about 30 members of the Island Volunteers who served during the Boer War, and a prominent Freemason, a member of many Island Lodges, including Grand Lodge, East Medina Lodge 175, and East Medina Chapter. He was also a member of the religious military order, Knights Templar and the Rose Croix.

Formerly he was a member of Ryde Rowing Club and Ryde Golf Club. He married twice, his first wife dying about 1910.

Mr. OSBORNE leaves a widow, and two daughters by his first marriage.

The funeral will take place at Ryde Parish Church on Tuesday at 3 p.m., followed by interment at Ryde Cemetery.
