DEATH OF MRS. J. H. PARRINGTON

The death occurred at the West Middlesex Hospital on Friday week of Mrs. **May Alice Amy PARRINGTON**, of 20 Prince-street. Her husband, Mr. J. H. PARRINGTON, died last November, and their only son lost his life on active service during the war. A native of Streatham, London, Mrs. PARRINGTON came to the town 28 years ago, and was held in high esteem. She was a member of the Parish Church Mother's Union, the British Legion women's section, and the Haylands Women's Institute. The Vicar (Canon A. CORY, R.D.) officiated at the funeral service at the Parish Church on Tuesday. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. S. A. FOSTER (brother-in-law and sister), Mr. E. BRYANT (brother), Mesdames H. M. LEE and M. MITCHELL (sisters-in-law), Messrs. S. W. G. and G. H. FOSTER (nephews), and Mrs. F. ELDRIDGE. Among others present were Mrs. A. SPRINGER, W. BARTLETT, E. LEWIS, A. C. LININGTON, G. BLOOMFIELD, E. M. HAYLES, J. HART (also representing Mr. J. HART), E. C. PRISMALL, A. T. HODGES, H. ROGERS, WAY, OAK, WILLIAMS, E. J. SHINER, H. WHITTINGTON, I. GOSDEN, V. CRANE, D. LOVEGROVE, W. GOBLE, MUNDELL, and J. REDSTONE. The interment was in the Ryde Cemetery and there were flowers from the Mother's Union, British Legion women's section, and Welby Whist Club.
