THE FUNERAL OF MR. WYATT

This funeral of the "Anglesea," took place on Monday afternoon; the deceased was a prominent member of the Foresters' and of the Buffaloes, a large number of whom attended as a mark of respect. The deceased died after a comparatively short illness on Thursday last.

The son and two brothers were the chief mourners. Chief Ranger STOCKS read the Foresters' funeral service, the Rev. LABOUCHERE, B.A., of All Saints' officiated.

FUNERAL OF MR. H. WYATT

The remains of the late Mr. **H. WYATT**, of the Anglesea Tavern, were interred at the Cemetery on Monday afternoon, the Rev. J. A. LABOUCHERE being the officiating clergyman.

The deceased was a Forester, and amongst the members of the local court attending were Bros., STOCKS, chief ranger; H. GRIFFIN, sub-chief ranger; W. WHITE, secretary; G. RANDS, treasurer; R. MORRIS, sub-secretary; J. TANSOM, WOODWARD, J. W. WALLER, GALLOP, MUNDELL, F. WHITE, and SPENCER.

Several of the local Buffaloes were also present, including D. G. P. G. FOWLES.

Flowers were sent in addition to those from relatives, by the employees at the Anglesea Brewery, "A few old friends," Mr. and Mrs. DUFFETT, and the Prince Consort Lodge of Buffaloes. Chief Ranger STOCKS read the funeral service for the Foresters. Master WYATT (son), Messrs WYATT (two brothers) and Mr. J. G. DUFFETT were the mourners.
