DEATH OF MR. G. H. DYER

Mr. **George Henry DYER**, who had resided at "Lemon Cottage," Cemetery-road, for the last ?? years, passed away on Wednesday last after a short illness. He was one of the oldest members of the Sick Benefit Club, and was a popular man in the village. For some years the late Mr. DYER was caretaker at the Cemetery. He was in his 80th year, and his death will be regretted by local residents.

The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon and was attended by a large number of mourners and others. The Rector (the Rev. S. Sumner STOOKS) conducted a short service in the Cemetery prior to interment, The mourners were as follows: Mrs. DYER (widow), Mr. J. DYER and Mr. S. DYER (sons), Mr. and Mrs. A. There were 19 beautiful wreaths laid on the grave, including one from the British Legion (Women's Section) of which organisation deceased's widow is a member.
