MR. H. J. DEAN

A personality, well known in Binstead as passed away with the death on Sunday at the age of 73, of Mr. **Henry James DEAN** of "Nas Domov", Newhaven-road, Binstead. Mr. DEAN took a great pride in his garden, and passers-by would frequently compliment him on the excellent results of his work. He was always eager to discuss his hobby with others and many people who would not otherwise have known him, came to consider him a friend, and would stop to converse with him over the garden hedge. He was a man of simple tastes, and a natural kindness of disposition endeared him to a large number of friends and acquaintances in the village. Formerly in business in Petersfield, where he had lived for 11 years, he chose on his retirement six years ago to reside in Binstead. He was taken ill during the summer and he bore his illness with great patience and was cheerful to the last.

The funeral service was held at the Binstead Cemetery Chapel on Tuesday, the Rector the Rev. C.S. STOOKS, M.A., officiating. The late Mr. DEAN's request that there should be neither flowers or mourning was faithfully observed. The chief mourners were the widow, Mr. W. H. J. DEAN (son) and Mrs. DEAN, Mr. and Mrs. E. FRANCIS, (daughter and son-in-law), and Miss Pamela DEAN (grand-daughter).
