THE LATE BANDSMAN COYNE

Ex-Postman **J. COYNE**, who, through the kindness of Col. E. W. CRADOCK was accorded a military funeral last week was well-known to the older generation of Ryde residents and was remembered as a clever piccolo player in the band of the 5th Vol. Battalion Hampshire Regiment. He was 77 years of age and a widower and had lived with his daughter, Mrs. WEBB until her death recently.

He was 27 years in the Middlesex Regiment (the "Die Hards"), and for a great many years in the local battalion, the members of which held him in great respect. The deceased had been greatly upset through the death of two sons during the war and he has now three sons still serving in India and Salonica.
