SUDDEN DEATH

Mr. **Arthur BARTLETT**, chemist of Cross-Street, died suddenly on Tuesday morning. He had been unwell for some time and had been medically attended by Drs. PRESTON and MACKENZIE. On the morning named, however, he seemed brighter than usual, but soon after his wife had gone downstairs he called her, and so on her return she found him gasping for breath, death taking breath in a minute or two. DR. MACKENZIE certified the cause of death to have been syncope, and no inquest was held.

DEATH

On Tuesday some little sensation was caused by the sudden death of Mr. **Arthur BARTLETT**, chemist, of Cross-Street, Ryde. He had been under medical treatment for kidney disease, but seemed rather better on Monday. His wife left him in bed on Tuesday morning. As she was arranging the breakfast she heard him cry out, and on going up stairs with a relapse .found that he had been seized by a relapse. Dr. MACKENZIE was immediately sent for, but on his arrival life was found to be extinct. He has given a certificate so no inquest will be necessary.
