DEATH OF MR. MORRITT

Many of our readers will learn with regret the death of Mr. **William Graveley MORRITT**, of Beechwood, Swanmore, which took place on Thursday, the 14th instant, after several weeks severe suffering. Some years since, the deceased purchased Beechwood for his residence, since which time he has endeared himself to all who had the privilege of his acquaintance. He was a kind-hearted charitable man, of unassuming manners and inoffensive life, and for some time filled the office of vicar's warden at the Church of St. Michael and All Angels', Swanmore. The deceased leaves a widow and four young children to lament their loss, for whom the greatest sympathy is expressed.

The funeral will take place in Tuesday next at 11.30 a.m., at Swanmore Church.

FUNERAL OF MR. MORRITT

The funeral of the late Mr. **W. G. MORRITT** took place on Tuesday. The service was performed by the Rev. W. F. J. HANBURY (vicar), assisted by the Rev. W. ALLEN. The service over the grave was performed by the Rev. WALTER'S (deceased brother-in-law), and the Rev. W. F. J. HANBURY. The choir sang "Lead kindly light," at the church, and at the grave "God's will be done" and "Now the labourer's task is o'er." the grave was lined with moss and flowers, and beautiful wreaths were sent by Mrs. Ernest MORANT (sister), "John and Annie" (brother), Rev. and Mrs. H. SILVATERS and family, Mrs. RUDGELY and "Cherry," Mr. and Mrs. MORANT GALE, Miss Edith ALLEN, the servants at Beechwood, members of St. Albans' (Sandown), congregation Miss JAMES and Miss PITMAN, Henry G. and Miss BRIGHAM, Colonel and Mrs. BLUNT, Mr. W. H. HINDAUGH, and Dr. and Mrs. MACKENZIE.

The coffin was of panelled English oak with brass fittings, the lid bearing a brass Calvary cross inscribed "William Graverley MORRITT. Born October 1st, 1851, Died March 14th, 1895

“Jesu Mercy.”

The mourners were Mrs. MORRITT (the widow), Mr. and Mrs. J. MORRITT of Sidmouth
Mr. and Mrs. MORANT, the servants, and deceased’s medical attendant (Dr. MACKENZIE.
Messrs. J.A. PURNELL carried out the funeral arrangements.
