FUNERAL OF MRS. F. E. R. GRAY

The funeral took place on Wednesday of Mrs. **Florence Elizabeth Ricketts GRAY**, aged 86, of 32 Swanmore-Road, where she had lived all her life. She was one of the original members of the British Legion women's section and for many years a standard bearer. She was also a member of the All Saints' Mothers' Union. She was the widow of Mr. George GRAY, a naval pensioner, who died in 1944, and who was signalman at the Royal Victoria Yacht Club.

The funeral at the Parish Church was conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. R.H. RUSSELL,

R.D.), and the mourners were Mr. R. GRAY (son), C.P.O. GRAY (grandson), Mr. and Mrs. D. FAGGETTER, Miss B. PLUMMER, Sqdn. Ldr. and Mrs. E. C. H. FAULKNER, and Mr. and Mrs. R.
