MR. A. J. WHEELER

With the death of Mr. **Arthur John WHEELER**, of 28 Daniel Street, Ryde, at the age of 69, a man has passed who devoted his life to serving the town in which he was born and brought up. Town Foreman of Ryde for many years Mr. **WHEELER** was respected by the men who worked under him and his opinion was always solicited by his superiors. The surveyor Mr. HOLNESS regarded him as a friend, and his loss cannot be replaced. An influential member of the Oddfellows Mr. WHEELER was for a long time one of the Trustees. His only hobby was gardening, and he had much success in developing many varieties of chrysanthemums. Frequent invitations to display his blooms were invariably refused by a man whose natural modesty had endeared him to a wide circle of friends. A window and one son, Mr. A. J. WHEELER, and two brothers, Messrs. Wallace and Edward J. WHEELER are left to mourn their sad loss.

The funeral service took place at Holy Trinity Church on Wednesday, and was attended by a great number of people.
