## **DEATH OF MR. A. REEVES**

Another old and respected resident of Ryde has passed away in Albert REEVES, of

Clarges-House, Nelson-Street, whose death occurred on Saturday, in his 77<sup>th</sup> year. The deceased was well-known amongst visitors and townsfolk through being engaged with the boats and bathing

machines which he owned, and which he had superintended foe many years, and his familiar and genial personality will be much missed . In his younger days he was an expert swimmer and a few could surpass him either as a swimmer or oarsman. He was of a very active disposition, and was out on Thursday evening, but taken ill at midnight. Dr. TURNER attended him, but he never recovered and succumbed to heart failure on Saturday midday.
