CRIMEAN VETERAN'S DEATH

The death took place at the County Asylum on Jan. 16th of **James Hewlett COX**, aged 77 years, late of Warwick-Street, Ryde.

The interment took place at Ryde on January 21st. The first part of the service was held at Holy Trinity Church, the Vicar (the Rev. J.E. EDDIS), and the Rev. N.H. STUBBS officiating. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack. There was a number of wreaths.

The deceased joined the Navy when he was a lad, and saw a great deal of service. During the Crimean War he served on board H.M.S. Tribune. He had four medals, Crimean 1854 with bar for Sebastopol, and one dated 1855, the Baltic medal 1854-1855 and one China medal with bar, Taku Forts 1858.

Deceased had two sons and two grandsons serving in the Royal Navy.
