DEATH OF MR. C. E. BUTCHER

The death of Mr. **Charles Edward BUTCHER**, of Victoria Cottage, Binstead Hill, occurred on Saturday. Mr. BUTCHER, who was much respected in the village, where he was born, was an old soldier. He had served in the South African War, notably at Rorkes Drift, and in the Transylvania campaign. After his discharge he was employed by Mr. JAMES, on his farm, until ten years ago. He was an old Chelsea Pensioner and had been for many years a member of the British Legion.

His passing followed a week's illness. His wife predeceased him about a year ago.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, the Rev. C. Heald officiating. The mourners were Mr. G. BUTCHER (son), Mr. and Mrs. J. SPARSHOTT and Mr. and Mrs. W.
