We deeply regret to announce the death of Mrs. **Eliza Mary SWEETMAN**, wife of Mr. Henry SWEETMAN, J.P., which took place on Monday morning at her residence, Eversley, Queen's-Road. Mrs. SWEETMAN. Who was 73 years old, had suffered from heart trouble for some time, but her end was unexpected, and only last Thursday she was present at the presentation to Captain Peter MACDONALD at Appley Hall. She was taken ill on Saturday evening when taking a sleep after dinner. As she was unusually long away Mr. SWEETMAN went to her and found she was unconscious. Medical aid was summoned, but she died without regaining consciousness.

A native of Clifton, Bristol, Mrs. SWEETMAN came to Ryde about 45 years ago, and had been married about 40 years. She was a member of the local branch of the Conservative Association and of the Primrose League, but took no active part in public life, though she rendered a great deal of assistance to her husband in his work. She leaves two daughters.

Mr. SWEETMAN is a senior Borough Justice, and at the sitting of the Bench on Monday

the Mayor (Alderman E. HAYDEN) referred to the passing of Mrs. SWEETMAN, and expressed the sympathy of his brother magistrates with Mr. SWEETMAN.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, a plain service being conducted at the Parish Church by the Vicar the Rev. W.N. MARTIN, assisted by the Rev. C.B. ATYEO. The interment followed at Ryde Cemetery.
