SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. M. J. OSBORNE

It is with profound regret that we have to chronicle the death of Mrs. **OSBORNE**, wife of Mr. Malcolm OSBORNE, of Ashton House, West-Street, which occurred with painful suddenness in the Mead Gardens on Thursday afternoon. Mrs. OSBORNE was having tea in the gardens, when she suddenly swooned, and died almost immediately. The body was removed to Ashton House. The doctor was able to give a certificate as to the cause of death and no inquest was necessary. Mrs. OSBORNE was well known, and very popular, and the news of her death has come as a painful shock to the town. The very deepest sympathy is felt with the bereaved husband and two little girls who are left to mourn the loss of a loving and devoted mother. The funeral took place, amid many manifestations of sympathy, on Monday afternoon.

The first portion of the service was held at All Saints Parish Church, conducted by the Rev. H. LE FLEMING, assisted by the Rev. R.B. DURRANT. The committal service was taken by the Vicar.

FUNERAL OF MRS. MALCOLM J. OSBORNE

The funeral of Mrs. Malcolm J. **OSBORNE**, whose demise occurred with such tragic suddenness of Thursday of last week, took place on Monday afternoon, amongst many signs of respect and regret. The cortege proceeded from the residence Ashton House, West-Street, to the Parish Church, where the first part of the service was held, the Vicar (the Rev. Hugh DE FLEMING, M.A.) and Rev. R.B. DURRANT, M.A., officiating.
