DEATH OF MR. BRIND

Much sympathy has been expressed with the widow and family of Mr. **Leo BRIND**, of "Cliftonville," Well-Street, whose death occurred at the County Hospital on Saturday evening following an operation for internal troubles. Mr. BRIND, who was 59 years of age, was the late superintendent of the Ryde Post Office where he served for 40 years, rising from a messenger boy. He was acting Postmaster for sometime until the recent appointment of Mr. Ben SEWARDS. The deceased was highly esteemed and very popular with the staff and retired through ill health, and on superannuation only three months ago when he was the recipient of a tangable expression of good will from his colleagues. He had been in hospital about a week, and the news of his death was a shock to his numerous friends. Mr. BRIND was a well-known member of the Ryde Conservative Club, and in his youth was a prominent athlete at outdoor gatherings.

The funeral was fixed for Wednesday, the service being held at St. Mary's High-Street.
