DEATH OF MR. CYRIL HUNT

There are many in Ryde and district who regret the death of Mr. **Cyril HUNT**, youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter H. HUNT. Which occurred at his home, Northleigh, Weeks-Road, on Sunday at the early age of 31. The late Mr. HUNT, who was connected with several local organisations, and was popular in the district. He had been in failing health for some considerable time, and had been confined to his bed for several weeks.

For a period of about 15 years he had been in the employment in the office staff of Messrs. CHAPLIN and Co. at Ryde. He joined the I.W Territorials at the outbreak of the war in 1914, and saw service with the battalion during its memorable landing at Gallipoli, also in Egypt. His father, W.H. HUNT, is the esteemed secretary of the Court Astraea, Ancient Order of Foresters, and the late Mr. Cyril HUNT had done valued work as hon. Secretary of the juvenile section. The deceased was also a member of the Ryde branch of the British Legion.

There was a representative attendance of mourners at the funeral on Wednesday, the Vicar (the Rev. Hugh LE FLEMING) officiating at the first part of the service at All Saints' Church, and afterwards at the interment, which took place at the Cemetery. The principal mourners were Mr. W.H. HUNT (father), Messrs. Arthur and George HUNT (brothers) and Mr. E.G. BEARD (brother-in-law). Others present were members of the British Legion as follow: Messrs. SAUNDERS, W.J. JONES, C.W.H.
