ARTHUR TEAGUE

The Funeral took place on Wednesday, amid many manifestations of public respect and sympathy, of the late Mr. **Arthur TEAGUE**, for some time a member of the Town Council and for many years a respected and much liked tradesman in the town. The first part of the service was held at the Wesleyan Church, and was conducted by the Rev. J. WHITEHEAD CLEGG. The hymns were "God moves in a mysterious way" and "Give me the wings of faith to ****". The organist (Mr. P******) played "Oh rest in the Lord."

JAMES, and others. The committal sequences ? at the Cemetery were pronounced by the Rev. J. WHITEHEAD CLEGG. The coffin of polished oak with brass fittings bore the inscription :

"Arthur TEAGUE,
died May 23rd, 1913
aged 62 years."
