### FUNERAL OF CAPT. F. LANE-FOX

The funeral of the late Capt. **F. LANE-FOX**, son of Mr. LANE-FOX, who holds a high office in the Primrose League, took place on Tuesday. Solemn Requiem Mass was sung at St. Mary's by the brother of the deceased, the Rev. Father Hilderbrand LANE-FOX, O.S.B., of Fort Augustus, Scotland, assisted by two other Benedictines from the Abbey of Solesmes, Appledurcombe, namely, the Rev. Fathers SAINTE-BEUVE and BLAUCHON-LASSERVE. The celebrant also conducted the service at the graveside. The choir of St. Mary's sang the music of the Mass and rendered "Jesu. Salvator mundi," very feelingly. They also sang the Benedictus at the grave. The Rector of the Mission (Bishop COTTER) was present with the choir.

The chief mourners were Mrs. Francis LANE-FOX (widow), Mr. and Mrs. LANE-FOX (father and mother), and other relatives. Deceased's mother belonged to a well-known Ryde family, having been a Miss SLADE prior to her marriage. Many of the St Mary's congregation were present to show their sympathy, both at the church and Cemetery. The church was draped in black and silver, a noticeable feature being the alter curtain, which has woven into it the quotation from the Office and Mass for the dead "Miseremini mei, saltem, vos mei amici"(Remember me, at least, you my friends). The side curtains also bear suitable texts.
