We regret to report the death of Mr. **George SAVILL** (73), a retired confectioner of 22 Wray-street, which took place at his home on Sunday afternoon while he was seated in a chair. Mr. SAVILL was one of the oldest members of St. Michael's Church, having been a chorister for 19 years, a sidesman, and a member of the Church Council.
