### A FATAL DOSE OF MORPHIA

Nurse **MCMILLAN** of the Royal Isle of Wight Infirmary, died on Sunday from an overdose of morphia. It seems that the deceased has suffered from sleelessness, and has been in the habit of taking the drug named by hypodermic injections as a means of relief. On Sunday morning she came off duty at six o'clock and went to bed. At dinner time, the nurse who occupies the same room noticed that something was the matter with her companion, and medical assistance was summoned. Every effort was made to save the nurse's life, but without avail; and she died at nine o'clock. A small phial containing the morphia and the syringe used for the injection were found in the bed. The deceased was 23 years of age. No inquest was deemed necessary by the Coroner.

The funeral of the deceased took place on Wednesday in the presence of a large number of people. The vicar of Sandown (the Rev. W. T. STORRS, B.D.) officiated. A large number of lovely wreaths were sent, amongst others by Miss FITZPATRICK (matron), Mr. and Mrs. OLDHAM, the nurses, the men patients, the women patients, Col., Mrs., and the Misses TATTNALL, Mr. and Mrs. Lionel HART, Mr. and Mrs. SANDERS, Miss SARGENT, and Mr. and Mrs, FURSE.
