FORMER TRADESMAN'S DEATH

The death occurred at Lucerne, John Street, on Monday, of Mr. **George E. STAMP**, eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James STAMP, who for many years carried on a butcher's business in the High Street. The deceased gentleman was a familiar figure in the town, and prior to leaving for Australia on account of ill-health, he owned a pork butcher's business in Ryde. His wife and daughter died in Australia, and he returned to settle in the town three years ago.

His death at the age of 62 years was greatly regretted by a large number of friends of this respected family. The deceased sustained a serious seizure on Saturday, and his death came as a happy release from suffering.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Thursday, the Rev. D. E. HUNTER officiating. The principal mourners were Mr. Sidney F. STAMP, Bournemouth, (brother), Mr. and Mrs. G. H.
