DEATH OF MRS. CARTER

We regret to record the death of Mrs. **CARTER**, widow of Mr. J. CARTER, fruiterer and greengrocer, High-street, which occurred on Saturday at a nursing home following an operation. The circumstances were of a very painful nature as the deceased lady was actively engaged in the conduct of her business during the earlier part of last week, her death being the result of blood poisoning. She had been in business in the town for about a quarter of a century, usually enjoying the best of health, and the announcement of her death came as a great shock to her many friends, sincere sympathy being expressed with the relations in the sudden bereavement which had overtaken them. Mrs. CARTER, who was 60 years of age, leaves a son and three daughters, and the loss of her kindly, familiar figure is keenly felt and deplored, as she was universally respected and esteemed by tradesmen and the general public.

The funeral took place from her late residence in High-street, on Tuesday afternoon, and was of an imposing character, the wreaths which numbered over 40, being conveyed in a separate car. These included a large beautiful cross composed of carnations, lilies, and chrysanthemums from the children, the others being from friends and relatives. The cortege proceeded direct to the Cemetery where a considerable number of sympathising friends attended.

The mourners comprised: Mr. T. CARTER (son), Mr. C. WYATT and Mr. W. J. BOTTOM (sons-in-law), Mr. J. W. DUFFETT, Mr. F. HUTCHINS, and Mr. WANT. The burial service was impressively carried out by the Vicar (the Rev. Hugh le FLEMING) and many lingered at the graveside to pay their last homage to their deceased friend.

The inscription on the coffin was:- "Minnie Maria CARTER, died 27th November, 1920, aged 60 years."
