

The following information was contibuted by Charles Said-Vassallo from Malta in February 2006: "Baron Sir Pasquale Sceberras Trigona KCMG 14th Barone of Castel Cicciano 13th Barone di Montagna di Marzo of Sicily was the last surviving Lord Lieutenant of Malta, he retired to the Isle of Wight some years prior to his death. He was knighted with many of those who were either involved with the Government of Malta or were Judges. A lot of the Nobility were granted Knighthoods. Even Pasquale's son was a CMG. I am aware that many of the Nobility bought land in England to try and improve their status as Nobles. He often stayed in England for long periods due to health or investment purposes. Pasquale spent much of his second marriage at the Isle of Wight maybe due to the connections with Queen Victoria's children who were in Malta and had been friends of Sir Pasquale. This was very likely".

In August 2008 Michael Torreggiani contributed the following information after a trip he made to Malta "Apparently Pasquale came to England as the representative of the nobles in Malta to bring their condolences as to the death of the Prince Consort and then stayed. He was a very small man, considering that Queen Victoria was also small, he was cruelly called by the courtiers 'Queen Victoria's lap dog' as he was even smaller than she".
