DEATH OF MRS. W. HAL GRAY

Our obituary records the death of Mrs. W. Hal GRAY, (eldest daughter of Mrs. CLAYTON, of Eastfield, Ryde, and the wife of Mr. W. Hal GRAY) which occurred after a long and painful illness on the 30th of January. Mrs. GRAY will be remembered as a valued member of the I. W. Amateur Fine Art Society, to whose exhibition she was formerly a contributor, and her clever sketches of Island scenery generally won the commendations of the judges.

The funeral took place on Monday last. The coffin was first taken to eastern door by the Rev. W. M. CAMERON (Vicar of Holy Trinity, Ryde), the Rev. A. P. CLAYTON (Vicar of Holy Trinity, Ventnor), and the Rev. C. F. CLAYTON. The Rev. W. M. CAMERON read the opening sentences of the burial service and the Epistle, and the Rev. A. P. CLAYTON the prayer and the collects. The mourners were Mrs. CLAYTON of Eastfield, Mr. W. Hal GRAY, Col. W. CLAYTON, Mrs. W. CLAYTON, Rev. A. P. CLAYTON, Rev. C. F. CLAYTON, Mr. I. F. CLAYTON, (brothers). Several friends and the nurses and servants also attended. The service at the grave was performed by the Rev. A. P. CLAYTON assisted by the Rev. E. P. CLAYTON.

NB: It has been noted there was a discrepancy on the 2nd marriage, whereby the middle name of William Gray was written as "Henry" instead of "Hal".
