NAVAL FUNERAL

The remains of Mr. **Richard STICKLAND**, First Class Petty Officer of *H.M.S. Aboukir*, were interred on Thursday afternoon with full Naval honours. The procession left the home of the deceased, at St. John's-road, Ryde, at 2.30 p.m. headed by a bugler from the R.M.L.I. who was followed by a large firing party from *H.M.S. Bulwark*. A detachment from *H.M.S. Prince of Wales* drew the gun carriage on which reposed the coffin, of polished elm with brass furniture, enveloped in a Union Jack and on which rested beautiful wreaths. Members of deceased's ship's company surrounded the gun carriage, behind which followed the family mourners. Local friends of the deceased and ships companies from *H.M.S. Aboukir* and *H.M.S. Vivid*, and several local coastguards brought up the rear.

The procession was met at the north door of All Saints' Parish Church, where the seamen's funeral service was conducted by the chaplain from *H.M.S. Aboukir*. The cortege then proceeded to the cemetery where the Chaplain pronounced the committal sentences, and the remains were entered. Three volleys were fired and the last post was sounded.

The coffin bore the inscription:

RICHARD STICKLAND Died January 12th, 1913 Aged 33 years.
