## SUDDEN DEATH ON THE ESPLANADE

A painful sensation was caused among those about on the Esplanade on Tuesday afternoon by the sudden death of Mr. **Thomas Raphe MILLS**, an old gentleman who has for some years past resided at Lawton House, The Strand.

At about 5.25 he was found by a neighbour lying on the pavement near the extreme easterly entrance to the gardens, having apparently fallen down in a fit to which he had been subject for years past. P.C. HAYES was called and found that deceased was black in the face, life apparently being extinct. Dr. BANKS, who was passing in his motor car, confirmed this view, and the body was taken later to the mortuary.

The Coroner was made acquainted with the occurrence, but in the light of the fact deceased had been previously medically attended for fits, he decided that an enquiry need not be held.

Deceased, who was well known as a close friend of the late Miss GODWIN, was 75 years of age.
