### THE LATE MRS. DIGBY DENT

The death of this lady on the 26th ult., and her burial at Ryde, where she had made many friends, recalls the tragic but heroic death of her husband, Mr. Digby Henry DENT (son of Admiral DENT), who whilst superintendent of prisons in the Straits Settlements, was mortally wounded in an outbreak of Chinese prisoners at Singapore when saving a warder from a murderous blow from an axe from one of the prisoners. Mrs. Digby DENT, who received a message of sympathy from the late Queen on her loss, was the sister of Mrs. MONTGOMERY, Græmsay, St. John's, Ryde.
