SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. LOADER

It is with great regret we record the death of Mrs. **Naomi LOADER**, wife of Mr. Charles LOADER, a well-known townsman of the High-Street. The death occurred in a somewhat painful manner on Sunday evening at her residence, Gershom Villa, Swanmore-Road. Mrs. LOADER, it appears, complained of giddiness, and on taking a seat, fell back in her chair. Efforts were at once made to revive her, but on medical assistance being obtained, it was found that life was extinct. Heart failure was the immediate cause of death. She was 58 years of age .

The funeral took place on Wednesday, when the Rev. C.L. BLAKE conducted the service at All Saints Church and the Cemetery. The mourners were Mr. C. LOADER (husband) and Messrs.

Edwin, Arthur, Frank and Alfred LOADER (sons), Mr. Rowland LOADER and Mr. Willis PRIOR (brother-in-law). Among those present in the church and following were Messrs. P. LOADER, T. HARVEY, S. BARTON, C.W. SALTER, H. WOODS, W. DORE, etc.

The body was enclosed in a polished elm coffin with massive brass fittings, and was concealed beneath a mass of beautiful flowers. Those sending wreaths were: C.
