The Hampshire Advertiser Saturday July 16, 1870

"The Endymion, 21, screw, Acting-Commander Bosanquet, lost her quartermaster, Thomas Harvey, who died from brain fever, between Auckland and Japan, in February, when, the officers and men subscribed the handsome sum of over £77 for his widow. An officer on board proceeded to Newport, Isle of Wight, for the purpose of presenting the money, and found that the widow had just previously received a communication from the Admiralty to the effect that there was no more pay due to her on her late husbands account, so the receipt of so large sum as generously subscribed must have proved very acceptable. The spontaneous and thoughtful generosity of the officer's and crew of the Endymion is highly creditable to the ship, and tends to show the good spirit which prevailed among all on board. The example is worthy of imitation."
