FATAL TERMINATION OF AN ACCIDENT

We regret to record the death of Mr. **RUTHERFORD**, whose sad accident we chronicled a fortnight ago. It will be remembered that Mr. RUTHERFORD was riding a young and spirited horse about the farm at Ashey when it reared up and Mr. RUTHERFORD fell back. He clung to the reins, and his weight pulled the animal back upon him. The pommel of the saddle was pressed into his stomach, and he sustained such serious injuries that, had it not been for the skill of Mr. Alfred WOODWARD, who attended very quickly and performed an operation, the poor man would have soon died. As it was hopes were entertained of his ultimate recovery, but mortification set in, and he died early on Saturday morning, all pain having left him fully two days before he died. Mr. RUTHERFORD, who was well known and generally respected, was 53 years of age.
