DEATH OF A NONAGENARIAN

The death took place on Sunday at Dorset House, Dover-street, of Miss Sarah Ann PAUL, who had reached the great age of 96. Miss PAUL was a daughter of Mr Joseph PAUL, F.R.G.S., who kept a school at Ormonde House, Wood-street, from 1858 to 1879. In her younger days she was a great traveller and her journeys included three trips to Australia in the old sailing ships. She was the oldest parishioner of Holy Trinity parish. The last time she was out of doors was to vote at the general election. The funeral took place on Wednesday, the first part of the service being held at Holy Trinity Church, where the body had lain since the previous evening. The Vicar (the Rev. S. A. MARSH) officiated and the mourners were Mrs. DOBBIE (niece), Miss CORSINI (grand niece), Miss SPRAGG and Mrs. COOPER, in whose care deceased had lived for five years. The interment was at the Cemetery, where the last rites were conducted by the Rev. A. WARDROPER, an old friend of the family.
