 doth put her self apprentice to *Arthur Debenham, Photographer of 28 Horse St. Right Jt.*

to learn his Art and with him after the Manner of an Apprentice to serve from the 25 day of May 1880

unto the full Endowed Term of four Years from thence next following to be fully complete and ended During which Term the said Apprentice her Master justly shall serve his words keep his lawful commands every where wholy he sh<sup>e</sup> shall do no damage to her said Master nor so to be done of others but to her. Never shall tell or forthwith give warning to her said Master of the same if she shall not waste the goods of her said Master nor lend them unlawfully to any she shall not contract Matrimony within the said Term nor play at Cards or Dice Tables or any other unlawful game whereby her said Master may have any loss with his own goods or other during the said Term without licence of her said Master she shall neither buy nor sell she shall not haunt Taverns or Playhouses nor absent her self from her said Master's service day or night unlawfully but in all things as a faithful Apprentice she shall behave herself towards her said Master and all his during the said Term And the said Master he hereunto agrees to pay his said apprentice by term of four shillings & sixpence during the first year, of five shillings per week during the second year of seven shillings & sixpence during the third year, & of ten shillings per week during the fourth & last year of the same. his said apprentice in the art of *Photography printing & retouching* which he useth by the best means that he can shall teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed Teaching unto the said apprentice that he shall The hours of usual attendance for the *teaching and all other necessary* during the said Term and *Melville & Housell* shall be from half past eight o'clock in the morning until half past seven o'clock in the evening, the usual hours being permitted for dinner &c.

And for the true performance of all and every the said Covenants and Agreements either of the said Parties hereth he self unto the other by these *Witnesses* whose names and the Parties above named to these Indentures interchangably have put their Hands and Seals the *day of May* and in the *Year of our Sovereign* *Lady Queen Victoria* by the Grace of God of the united Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland* *QUEEN* Defender of the Faith and in the Year of our *Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and*
