FUNERAL OF MR. S. HAIR

The Rev. C. HEALD officiated at the funeral of Mr. **Sydney HAIR**, of Hill Crest, Arnold-road, at the Parish Church on Saturday. Mr. W. L. REED (the deceased's brother-in-law) was at the organ and played "Blest are the departed." "I know that my Redeemer Liveth," and "O rest in the Lord." The hymns sung were "Abide with me" and "Jesu, Lover of my soul," and the Nunc Dimittis was chanted. The mourners were Mr. D. HAIR (brother), Mr. C. REED, Mr. T. CLEAVER, and Mr. and Mrs. E. BAKER (brothers-in-law and sister-in-law), Mr. H. HAIR (uncle), Driver F. W. HAIR, Lce-Corpl. HAIR, and Mr. and Mrs. T. E. CLEAVER (nephews and niece). Several mainland relatives and friends were prevented by travel arrangements from being present. Among those present were Sir Henry SWEETMAN, J.P. (chairman of the I.W. Conservative and Unionist Association), Capt. H. A. DRUDGE (representing Capt. P. D. MACDONALD, M.P.), Mrs. M. JOLLIFFE (hon. treasurer), Mrs. T. E. GIBSON (representing Mr. T. E. GIBSON, hon. secretary), and Mr. W. JOLLIFFE (Binstead Conservative Association), Mrs. C. BUTT (vice-chairman Ryde Conservative Association), Mr. C. MERRILL, T.C. (representing the Mayor of Ryde, Mr. WEEKS), Messrs. E. VENUS, and H. B. HILL (trustees of Binstead Institute), Mr. C. LIFE (Vectis Boating and Fishing Club), Messrs. S. WHEELER, G. BEERE, O. J. FEBEN, C. VIGAR, E. JAMES, and B. H. WOODMANSEY, Mr. and Mrs. H. BARTON, and Miss SPRINGER. The interment was at Ryde Cemetery and the floral tributes included those from Capt. and Lady Jean MACDONALD; the I.W. Conservative and Unionist Association; Binstead Conservative Association; trustees of Binstead Institute; employees at Newnham Farm; and Messrs. TEAGUE and Co. Mr. C. LANGDON was the undertaker.
