DEATH OF MRS. WALLACE CAWS

We regret to record the death on Friday week at 9 Queen's-road, of Mrs. **Blanche Fanny CAWS**, wife of Mr. Wallace CAWS, a Trinity House pilot. For many years she was a greatly esteemed resident of Seaview, being a member of the GREENHAM family. She was actively associated with the work of the Wesleyan Church. The deceased lady possessed a singularly kind and happy nature that endeared her to a wide circle of friends, and her demise is deeply regretted. She was 58 years of age. The Rev.
