FUNERAL –

The funeral of the late Mr. Lewis Savigny LAMBRICK, of Ryde, who died at Ventnor on Saturday, took place at the Ryde Cemetery on Thursday afternoon. Deceased, who was well known in Ryde, was born at Calcutta, India, on January 16th 1870, and was educated at Mercers Grammar School, London. About eleven years ago he came to Ryde owing to his health. He was the nephew of the late General LAMBRICK, of the R.M.L.I., aide-de camp to Queen Victoria, a gentleman well known in Ryde. The deceased was buried in a coffin of polished elm, with heavy brass fittings, and bearing the inscription “Lewis Savigny LAMBRICK, died April 11th, 1914, aged 44 years.” An impressive service was held at All Saints’ Parish Church, at which the Rev. C.L.BLAKE officiated. The chief mourners were the widow, only son, and stepson. There were also about 20 of the Ryde and Ventnor Y.M.C.A. Scouts present.
