DEATH OF MR. E. T. WARD

A respected inhabitant, Mr. Edmund Tom WARD, passed away at 43 Melvillestreet on Monday after a long illness. He was 86 years of age. A member of an old Ryde family he commenced business some 60 years ago as a bicycle agent and it eventually developed into a flourishing motor and charabanc trade. He retired some 10 years ago. He will be remembered as a pioneer of cycling in the Island, one of the first members of the Vectis Cycling Club, and an original member of the cyclists corps which before the war was attached to Princess Beatrice's I.W. Rifles. He was a frequent prizewinner. His chief recreation was small boat sailing. He took part in the races of the old Amateur Sailing Club, whose headquarters were on the pier. Mr. WARD was one of the oldest members of the Conservative Club. In younger days, he was a chorister at the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, Nelson-street, and later at Garfield-road Church. His genial and kindly disposition won him many friends. His wife predeceased him 22 years ago and his son, Corpl. Edgar WARD, the Machine Gun Corps, lost his life at Passchendale. Two sons and two daughters survive him. The funeral service was held in Holy Trinity Church on Thursday, the Rev. L. N. St. ALPHONSE (Vicar) officiating. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. J.
