PROMINENT FREEMASON'S DEATH

Mr. **Walter Charles Frederick HARVEY**, of 104 Monkton-street, died at the Royal I.W. County Hospital on Friday week at the age of 80. A lifelong resident he succeeded to the coal and corn merchant's and fruiterer's business of his father, the late Mr. Thomas HARVEY, before the first world war. Although retiring as a coal and corn merchant during the last war, he maintained an active interest in the fruiterer's business until his recent illness. A Freemason for 38 years, he was a past master of the East Medina Lodge, and held provincial honours. He was a member of the Ryde Club and Conservative and Golf Clubs. He was a bachelor. The funeral, at Holy Trinity Church on Tuesday, was conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. H. E. GIBSON), assisted by the Archdeacon (the Ven. A. CORY). Mr. E. S. SHEPPARD (organist), accompanied the singing of "Jesu, Lover of my soul," the 23rd Psalm, and a Masonic hymn. The mourners were Messrs. H. LOADER, C. G. BAILEY, John BAILEY (also representing Mrs. C. PUSEY, niece), and James BAILEY (nephews), Miss G. M. LOADER (niece), Mr. and Mrs. A. LACEY (cousins), and Miss E. SAUNDERS and Miss J. NASH (staff). The East Medina Lodge and other Masonic Lodges, the Ryde Club, and the Conservative and Golf clubs were represented. The interment was at Ryde Cemetery.
