DEATH OF MISS PINE

The death took place on Saturday at Grenfell, Pellhurst-road, of Miss **Elizabeth Ann PINE**, a greatly respected resident. Miss PINE, who had reached the great age of 82, in earlier life was a State registered nurse and masseuse. On retiring many years ago during the last illness of her mother, she devoted her voluntary services to those in need. By her passing the Baptist Church loses a very valued worker and her memory will be revered by members of the Christian Alliance of Women and Girls at Garfield-hall, which she did so much to foster. The funeral was on Tuesday, the interment being at the Cemetery, following a service at the house. The Rev. M. Lister GAUNT, of Sandown, a former pastor of the Baptist Church, officiated, and deceased's favourite hymn, "In Emmanuel's land," was sung. The mourners were Messrs.
