### **DEATH OF MR. H. S. HAYCO**

We regret to announce the death on Tuesday after a very short illness of Mr. **Harry HAYCO**, of 7 Dover-street. Mr. HAYCO was for many years prominently associated with business and sporting circles in Liverpool. Over 10 years ago he retired from the managing directorship of a large jewellery business and came to Ryde, where he often spent his holidays. It was during one of these early visits that he became closely connected with the local Golf Club, of which he was a vice-president and gave the first cups for championship play in the men's and women's sections. In the world of Freemasonry he took a deep interest and was a prominent figure of the movement in Lancashire and Cheshire, of which he was a P.P.J.G.D., ranking in the 30<sup>th</sup> Degree. He was also a Provincial Officer of the Preceptory. He married Miss BARTON, a sister of the late John BARTON, a former mayor of Ryde, whose death only three weeks ago greatly affected him.
