DEATH OF MISS DASHWOOD

The death occurred, after a short illness on Friday week, following an operation at the County Hospital, of Miss **Alice DASHWOOD**, one of the last surviving members of a very old and respected local family. Miss DASHWOOD who was the daughter of the late Jonathan Guy DASHWOOD and was 76 years of age, had resided at Grove Lodge, Dover-street, since the death of her brother, the late Col. Frank DASHWOOD. Although she took no part in the public affairs of the town she was much beloved for her work on behalf of the Church, and for many kindly acts unobtrusively performed. The funeral took place on Monday, the first part of the service being held at St. James's Church. Psalm 90 was chanted, and the hymn "For all Thy saints, O Lord," was sung, the choir, with Mr. CHENNELL at the organ, leading the singing. The service was conducted by the Rev. R. S. EDDLESTON (incumbent), who said St. Paul referred to a woman in the Church at Rome as "Our sister, a servant of the Church, and a succourer of many." He thought those words applied to their departed sister. It was persons like her who the Church greatly needed today. The chief mourners were Mr. and Mrs. G. WADDINGTON (nephew and niece), Messrs. Guy, John, and Philip WADDINGTON (great-nephews), Miss Emily BALLARD, Nurse TILLEY, Mr. Ernest DASHWOOD, and Mr. Richard BLECHYNDEN. Amongst those present at the church were Dr. J. D.
