## GARDENER'S SUDDEN DEATH

The death took place very suddenly on Tuesday morning of Mr. **John Henry WEAVING**, a jobbing gardener, of 11 Player-street, where he had lived alone for four years since the death of his mother. Deceased, who was 53, had been out of employment until the day of his death, when he obtained work at Brookfield, Binstead, when he commenced at 8 oclock. Less than an hour afterwards he complained of indigestion and was told to rest for a few moments. Five minutes later his employer found him in a collapsed condition and as his attempts to revive him proved unsuccessful Dr. T. SIM was summoned, but on his arrival found that life was extinct. The facts were reported to the Coroner, but after a post-mortem examination an inquest was deemed unnecessary.

NB: It was noted that although he was known as **Harry**, the official records list his name as **John Henry**.
