### THE LATE MRS. CHARLES LANGDON

The death took place on Friday week of Mrs. **Anne Jane LANGDON**, wife of Mr. Charles LANGDON, of 13 Melville-street. The end came quietly after a period of failing health extending over two years. The late Mrs. LANGDON, who was 82 was a daughter of Mr. Robert NEWMAN, a master baker, who carried on business in Green-street. Of a retiring nature, she nevertheless evinced a deep interest in many good causes and manifested her practical sympathy by generous

assistance. She will be greatly missed by the family circle and many friends, by whom she was much loved. Deep sympathy is felt with her husband in the severance of a happy partnership of nearly 57 years. On Tuesday the remains, encased in a wax-oak coffin, were taken to St. Thomas's Church by permission of Mr. G. R. BRIGSTOCKE, C.A., and the funeral service took place on Wednesday, her son-in-law, the Rev. Cowper JOHNSON, rector of Dickleborough, Norfolk, officiating. Mr. H. C. F. LANDER at the organ played "Lamentations" (Henry SMYTH) and "Blest are the departed" (SPOHR). The mourners were Mr. C.
