Mr. Charles LANGDON, of Player-street, has received particulars of the gallant death of his eldest son 2nd Lieut. **Arthur Charles LANGDON**, who was in the Hampshire Yeomanry, when the war broke out, and joined up on mobilization. He rushed a German post in a farm, got wounded and surrounded, and was hidden by the civilians. There he was for three hours till the battalion captured the farm and found him. His action was spendid, and he was put in for the Military Cross. You have the sympathy of all the battalion and his many friends." Capt. Brent GOOD has also written paying the highest tribute to deceased's gallantry and heroism.
