EX-POLICEMAN'S FUNERAL –

The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery on Wednesday of Mr. Samuel ORCHARD, of Oxford Lodge, Newport-street, whose death occurred on Saturday at the County Mental Hospital. Mr ORCHARD, aged 76, was a native of Arreton and joined the old borough police force in 1895. He attained the rank of sergeant and retired in 1922. In his early days he was a devoted worker for the United Methodist Church in Newport-street, and was a lifelong member of the Foresters. His wife died 18 years ago and he leaves an only son. The Rev. H.Bramwell HOWARD and the Rev. A.J.WOODNUTT officiated. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. W.C.ORCHARD (son and daughter-in-law), Mr. E.WHEELER (nephew), and Mr. A.E.RANN (brother-in-law). Also present were Mr. E.CALLAWAY (representing Mr. R.WHEELER, nephew), Inspector F.G.RUGMAN (representing Ryde police), Messrs. C.WARNE and A.T.HODGES (members of the old borough police), and Mr. and Mrs. F.C.LAKE. The wreaths included one from the Ryde police.
